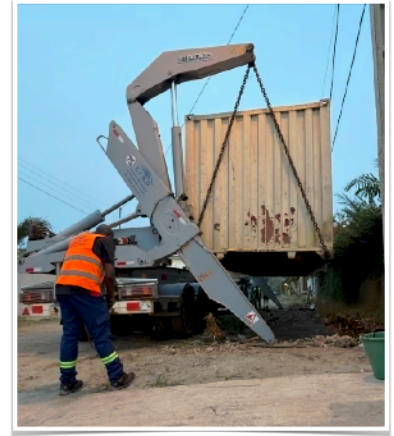




Dear Friends and Faithful Supporters,

Container Moved - As we mentioned in our January letter, we were trying to move our 40-foot shipping container of belongings from San Pedro to Bouaflé. After talking with a couple different companies about it, the Lord provided a way through a contact that Hannah had made last year. Thankfully, the shipping company had a self-loading container mover, as we were not sure how easily we would be able to get someone else to unload the container in Bouaflé. The self-loading machine does all the work itself, which was much simpler (see photos). The trip was long, but the container made it to Bouaflé on January 30th. The dirt road to our property was not great, but we thank the Lord for the dry conditions that made it easier to get the container to the property. The expert driver was able to place the container on the edge of our property, exactly where we wanted it!

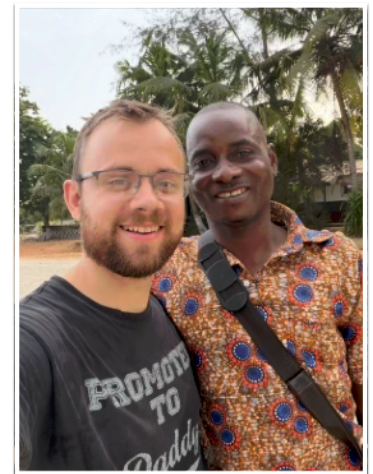


I (Nathan) accompanied the container with my father-in-law, my brother-in-law Gideon, and Daniel and Azariah. We spent the next day taking carload after carload of furniture and belongings from the container to our rental house, about a 10-minute drive away. We were very tired, but we accomplished much, and I'm very thankful for their help.



While we were in Bouaflé unloading our container, Hannah assisted at the birth of her sister Susanna's baby. We are thankful that all went well!

Last Details in San Pedro - Upon our return to San Pedro, the last thing we still needed to wrap up before moving to Bouaflé was to complete the process of obtaining our Ivorian driver's licenses, which we had started in January. Although our American licenses are unofficially recognized here, we've been wanting to get Ivorian licenses ever since we arrived in the country. We were told that we would have to do this within three months of entering Côte d'Ivoire, so our re-entry in December meant we had until March to complete the five-week process. Since we were doing it in San Pedro, our move was delayed by a couple of weeks, but we are thankful that we both got our licenses in February.

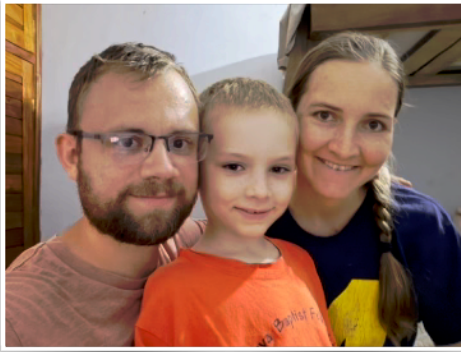


SAYING GOODBYE TO FRIENDS
